However, it is often the child who pays the price. On the other hand, single families often have less tension compared to the tension in families before divorce. With reduced tension, the single parent can focus more clearly on the child's needs. Usually parents and children are more willing to co-operate with each other to find solutions to solve household problems in single parent families.
